Home-School Partnership Programme

In the Western Cape:

- 55 new teacher- facilitators trained
- 33 received UCT certificates
- 8 received Wordworks certificates
- 46 schools ran parent programmes
- 606 parents completed the programme and graduated

In Montagu (Breede River Winelands):

- 33 new teacher-facilitators trained and received Wordworks certificates
- 7 schools/ creches ran parent programmes
- 102 parents completed the programme and graduated

EARLY LITERACY PROGRAMME

In the Western Cape:

- 56 schools and I library ran volunteer programmes
- 338 volunteers worked with 1796 children
- 7 partner organisations ran the Early Literacy Programme as part of their work

In the Eastern Cape:

- 10 sites were supported by Wordworks to run volunteer programmes
- 39 volunteers reached 216 children
- 4 partner organisations ran the Early Programme as part of their work

6 additional partner organisations delivered the programme in Gauteng, Natal and Zimbabwe
