WORKING COLLABORATIVELY TO SUPPORT EARLY LANGUAGE AND LITERACY

We have always worked collaboratively with individuals, schools, organisations and institutions who have participated in our training and are using one of our programmes in their work.

We are now working more actively to grow a network that promotes the importance of, and supports the development of children's early language and literacy.

Members of WordNetworks will receive:

2016 HIGHLIGHTS

STELLAR



3000 Grade R teachers, 80 WCED advisors, 6 Wordworks Support-Advisors, and 250 Emergent Literacy Lead Teachers participated in a jampacked 5 days of STELLAR Emergent Literacy Training across the Western Cape in July!



The year-long roll out of the STELLAR programme ended with certification ceremonies and inspiring exhibitions by teachers from all the education districts.

Every word counts



50 ECD practitioners, assistants and home visitors attended monthly Every word counts workshops in Worcester in 2016. They gained deeper insight into how to talk and play with babies and very young children to build language and lay the foundations for reading and writing.



Our EWC team is on a big drive to develop home-made resources from recycled materials to help provide much needed stimulation for babies and young children.

Home-School Partnerships



69 teachers from 33 schools from as far afield as Montagu, Belhar, Mitchells Plain and Hout Bay, gathered to share the highlights of 2016 and secure further support from Wordworks for their ongoing programmes.



529 parents graduated in 2016 after attending eight HSPP sessions with dedicated teachers from their children's schools. The workshops helped them find out how best to support informal learning at home.

Ready, steady...read and write!



In September, 200 Tutors and Site Co-ordinators who tutor at schools across Cape Town and in Darling and Morreesberg, gathered at the first annual Ready, steady ... read and write Indaba.



Little ones from our RSRW schools across Mitchells Plain, Grassy Park and further afield were excited about the certificates, storybooks and treats they got as a reward for their efforts to improve their reading and writing.
