Dear Colleagues

As we all look for sustainable, cost-effective and scalable solutions to the literacy crisis in South Africa, we hope that you will be inspired by the work reflected in this report.

From humble beginnings in 2006, the network of schools using Wordworks programmes has grown to 125, with many schools sustaining programmes over a number of years. We have worked hard to grow our reach, while remaining committed to quality and sustainability. Our strategy of scaling through partnerships continues to show benefits, with the majority of schools continuing to run programmes well beyond the year of training. We are proud to be partnering with districts and with other nonprofit organisations who support the quality and growth of programmes in schools.

In the past year, we have seen a growing demand for our school-based programme for parents, and we continue to hear how transformative this programme is for schools and for teachers who are realising the potential of working together with families in the communities they serve. Our tutoring programme is demonstrating positive shifts in the early reading and writing of children who would otherwise not have had access to targeted support. Through feedback from schools and partners, and increasingly robust monitoring and evaluation, we are seeing how programmes to engage families and communities can have an impact on literacy outcomes in under-served communities.

In 2017, we invested in revising and strengthening the Stellar materials that were part of the provincial rollout of the Grade R teacher training in 2016. The new materials include more comprehensive activities for a full two-week cycle of teaching as well as a new Teacher's Guide which offers outlines and materials for six parent meetings, so that teachers can share what they do in Home Language lessons and resource parents to support learning at home.

We are excited about building stronger partnerships with Districts to grow and sustain this important work.

We hope you find this update useful and look forward to your feedback.

Early literacy programmes by Wordworks



This programme can be used across a range of community settings to introduce those who care for and work with babies and young children to new knowledge about early learning and practical ideas for supporting the development of language, early literacy and maths concepts, from birth to 5 years of age.

Wordworks trains trainers and equips organisations to integrate the programme and resources into their work with parents and caregivers through home visits or parenting group sessions. ECD practitioners and playgroup facilitators can use what they learn through the programme in their daily interactions with children in crèches and playgroups.

This programme is for parents and caregivers of babies and children up to 5 years of age.



Home-School Partnerships

This programme can be used to facilitate a learning space for parents in which to share knowledge and ideas about children's language and early literacy development. The programme builds co-operation between families and schools, and encourages parents in their role as their children's first teachers.

Wordworks trains, provides resources and mentors teachers to facilitate weekly workshops for groups of parents of children aged four to eight years. The workshops run for $2\frac{1}{2}$ hours a week over eight weeks.

This programme is for parents and caregivers of children aged 4-8 years.





This programme can be used to provide resource-based training to strengthen the teaching of language and emergent literacy in Grade R.

Wordworks trains and mentors Grade R teachers and STELLAR trainers. The programme offers 5-day training and monthly workshops for Grade R teachers to support their classroom practice within a 2-week story-based framework. The programme aims to give opportunities for reflection and planning, and deepens teachers' understanding of the important role they play in building early language and literacy.

This programme is for Grade R teachers working with children aged 5-6 years.



Ready Steady Read Write

This programme can be used in Grade R to build a solid language and literacy foundation and as an early intervention in Grade One. It can also be used to support Grade Two and Three children to learn to speak, read and write in a second language.

Wordworks trains and mentors site co-ordinators who manage and support tutors to work with pairs of children, on a weekly basis, for at least six months. Many of the tutors are women from local school communities who volunteer. No qualifications are required.

This programme is for tutors working with children aged 5-8 years.



UPDATE: Stellar Home Language Programme for Grade R

We are delighted to hear from so many schools that teachers and children continue to love the Stellar stories and that the two-week story-based teaching cycle is working well in classrooms.









Here are some lovely examples of Grade R learners' work from 2018, showing drawing and emergent reading and writing.

Revisions

While Districts have been busy with R-Maths training, we have used this time constructively to revise the Stellar materials! Our revisions have drawn on feedback from the field, particularly our work with the Curriculum Advisors and the Lead Teachers in the ELIT provincial rollout in 2016 – and for this rich source of experience we are deeply grateful.

So what has changed?

The story packs and *Teacher's Guides* still have the warm, practical and supportive approach that teachers have loved. Spot, Ali, Baby Bird and all the other favourite stories are still there! The revisions include:

- New content, so that the two-week cycle includes whole class and rotation activities every day
- Integration of fifteen minutes of phonological awareness and letter-sound activities into each day's programme (in place of a separate Letters and Sounds Manual). Two new letters are introduced for each story instead of one.
- More listening activities and additional shared

- writing and reading activities
- A brand-new Teacher's guide for parent meetings, to assist teachers to reach out to families as partners in early learning
- Revised activities
- · Improved translations.

Training materials

We have repackaged the ELIT five-day training manual so that it aligns with the new Teacher's Guides. The training content is presented in a flexible, modularised format comprising four Workbooks for Teachers and accompanying Guides for Facilitators:

- **1** An Introduction to the Stellar Home Language Programme
- 2 Listening and speaking
- 3 Emergent reading and writing
- 4 Phonological awareness and letter-sound knowledge.

Future resourcing and capacity building

Looking ahead, we know that there is a need to offer emergent literacy training for new Grade R teachers coming into schools, and a need to continue to build the capacity of teachers who trained in 2016. This is what Wordworks can contribute to this effort:

- Provide district officials and HODs with a 1½ day Stellar refresher and orientation to the new materials. We will not charge for our facilitation, but Districts will need to offer a venue and purchase materials. Contact us on info@wordworks.org.za to make arrangements.
- Wordworks will offer the revised and extended Stellar materials at discounted prices to all WCED schools.
- Wordworks will offer orientation workshops to interested Grade R teachers who wish to buy the updated Stellar materials. (See page 2 for details about the first of these workshops.)

Planning meeting

A total of 131 new teacher–facilitators were trained to facilitate the HSP programme at Western Cape schools this year. While most training still takes place in the Metro, the picture shows training conducted in the West Coast District for the second year running.

Parent graduations

Proud parents at Eldene Primary School graduation. A total of 1 081 parents graduated from the HSP Programme in the Western Cape last year and we anticipate a similar number in 2018.



Facilitator clusters

'Refresh and Reflect' clusters are held in the third term each year. This 2017 photo (below left) shows facilitators discussing the kinds of story books that parents should be encouraged to read with their children.





Portfolios

New HSP teacher–facilitators submit portfolios of evidence to Wordworks to reflect on their facilitation of the parent programme and to receive a certificate. The teacher–facilitator training is registered as a short course at UCT. This year, 59 teachers have applied to submit individual portfolios for this short course. (Photo above right.)

Facilitator graduation

New HSP teacher–facilitators attend a certification ceremony in the fourth term each year to celebrate their completion of the programme for the first time. This photograph shows the 2017 ceremony, where 115 teachers from 34 schools received facilitator's certificates. This year we anticipate 149 teachers from 62 schools will graduate.



UPDATE: Ready Steady Read Write

Assessing and selecting learners

RSRW learner assessments are done at the start of the year to establish a base line and to select children in need of additional support. Here we see assessments at Alpine Primary School.



Training tutors

RSRW tutor training is held three times a year in the Western Cape. The photo shows a group of new tutors training at West End Primary School. So far, we have trained 71 RSRW tutors this year.



Tutors with children at sites

Tutors work with pairs of children for an hour a week. This photo shows a tutor session at Laurie Hugo Primary School. Tutor programmes are running at 73 sites in the Western Cape this year.



Training co-ordinators

There is an intake of new RSRW site coordinators each year. This year, 14 coordinators attended a three-day training in April. These co-ordinators were trained to set up and manage sites at eight new schools.



Cluster meetings

RSRW tutor teams attend refresher clusters each year: 138 people participated this year. The focus was on children's writing. These beaming tutors won a Ready Steady quiz at their cluster in Grassy Park.



Mid-year assessments

Learner assessments take place mid-year to establish if children need to join the programme or stay on it for the rest of the year. This assessment took place at Ysterplaat Junior Primary School. (Photo below left.)






Tutoring children

Pre-test

All children who participate in the Ready Steady tutoring programme are assessed at the beginning, middle and end of Grade 1. Assessment results indicate progress on measures of letter–sound knowledge, word reading and writing.


